GB Walkers for European Championships 2022– Munich

Congratulations to Tom Bosworth (20km), Bethan Davies (35km), Heather Lewis (20km) and Callum Wilkinson (20km) on their selection for the European Athletic Championships in Munich, 15-21 Aug.

Dominic King has not been selected despite having an automatic qualifying time for the 35km. The selection policy stated that for the 35km either a QT of 2:45.00 (35km) or 3:54:00 for 50km. Dom bettered the 50km mark with a new British record of 3:51:13 set in Dudince in March 2021, which was within the qualification window of 21st Jan. 2021 to 26th July 2022. Under the selection policy Dom has the right of appeal.

Race Walk Standards & Qualifying Window announced for the World Championships 2023 – Hungary

The World Athletics Council (has) approved entry standards for the 10,000m, marathon, combined events and race walk(s) at the World Athletics Championships Budapest 23, which will be held 19-27 August next year. The entry standards are projected to provide 50% of the quota in each event and were determined by statistical analysis of recent years' performance levels. The remaining quota in each event will qualify either through world rankings, finishing position at designated competitions or by wild card.

Tom Bosworth announces his retirement

Tom Bosworth (Tonbridge AC) has announced that he is to retire at the end of the season.



Silver medallist at the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast in Australia, Bosworth, 32, announced on social media on that injuries have taken their toll and he was ending his career which began full-time in 2009 - but he is determined to finish on a high with another Commonwealth medal at Birmingham this summer.

Bosworth joined Tonbridge AC as an 11-year-old and began full-time training at Leeds Beckett University with coach Andi Drake.

He made his Team GB debut in 2009 and his first taste of a major championships came at the Commonwealth Games in Delhi in 2010, where he finished 11th. Part of Team GB's Olympic squad for 2016, he finished sixth in the 20k racewalk and was 25^{th} last year in Tokyo.

The current world-record holder over 3000m indoors and outdoors, and the fastest man in the world over one mile, Bosworth has also won multiple British titles and holds British records over 20k and 5000m indoors.
