VALE VAREL NEWMARK 1939 - 2024 ... a VAWC legend

This evening I received the sad news that **Varel Newmark** – former VAWC and Preston AAC member – has passed away, aged 83.

My first memory of the feisty, combative Preston walker came on my joining the VAWC in late 1967. Chief among my first impressions of him was his aggressive racing. Short in stature but with a quick stride few could match, he always shot straight to the front at the gun and stayed there until someone mustered what it took to pass him. While this approach inevitably took its toll on his reserves, Varel would continue to scrap for every yard (we were still imperial then) and never stopped fighting until the race was done or he was spent. The example in perseverance this set for newcomers to the club was profound. Whatever the outcome, he threw everything he had into every contest.

Varel was a champion of the sport and passionate in his support of the VAWC. He raced virtually every week during the winter, proudly leading representative teams in interstate competitions, and he was also an indefatigable fund raiser for the club. When Jim Gleeson, Clarrie Jack and I achieved the milestone of membership of the nascent Australian Centurions in 1971, it was Varel who put together framed photo montages for each of us to celebrate the achievement. A tough competitor in his own right, he was always encouraging of the efforts of others, as any true clubmate will be.

Following today's news, Tim Erickson has updated a profile piece he wrote on Varel several years ago, which chronicles not just his imposing competitive history, but his fundraising prowess, his resilience in the face of adversity and his uncompromising stance on fairness and justice. As for me, I am so thankful to have been able to contact Varel (then resident in Tasmania) and invite him to the VAWC/VRWC's Centenary celebration. Nothing would have kept him away, and it didn't.

The VRWC sends its sincere condolences to Varel's wife Fay, to his family and friends. In accordance with his wishes there is to be no funeral, but instead a scattering of his ashes near his and Fay's favourite café.

** AUSTRALIAN TEAM FOR ANTALYA ANNOUNCED

Athletics Australia has released the list of walkers selected for the **World Teams Race Walking championships**, to be held in Antalya, Turkiye, on 21 April.

Numbers are boosted by the inclusion, for the first time, of a Marathon Mixed relay, which permits each nation to field up to 3 teams. The Antalya Mixed relay will serve as a kind of selection trial for the Paris Olympic race, for which a field of 25 teams will be selected.

This will come at the expense of the 20km in Antalya, since it cannot be contested by our fastest walkers who are selected for the Relay and the two events are held on the same day. Nevertheless, it opens the door for vital international 20km experience to be gained by the up-and-coming talent emerging around the country, who otherwise would have struggled to make the team.

The U20 10km event brings not only excitement for Australia but also a sense of wonder, as only one of the team, Marcus Wakim, has previously raced internationally (Muscat 2022). The Men's team, all of whom have either WA Top-10 rankings or a PB that would place them there, will be at least competitive and at best key players amongst their rivals from Asia, Europe and Latin America. Two years ago in Muscat, our Women's U20 team reached the podium and the Men have a good chance of doing so in Antalya.



** WALKER OF THE WEEK **



After several weeks of celebrating the efforts of the country's young, emerging walkers, it's a pleasure to visit the other end of the 3-score and 10 and to announce that **Lyn Ventris (WA)** – one of Australia's highest-achieving Masters athletes – is this week's WOTW.

Competing in last weekend's Australian Masters championships at Domain Athletic Centre, Hobart, Lyn walked an exemplary 5000m to win the W65 division with a time of **28:37.28** – an age-grade rated performance of 91%. Lyn, of course, is well known to the Masters race walking scene here and worldwide. She currently holds 11 World and 14 Australian Masters records, over distances ranging from 1500m to 20km and ages from 45+ to 60+. Like her fellow multiple world record holder Heather Carr, Lyn presents an indispensable model to all those of middle and advanced age, not just for maintaining a healthy lifestyle, but for setting lofty goals and achieving highly amongst one's peers.

Congratulations, Lyn. May you continue as a standard bearer in walking, and in sport in general, for all ages.

POLAND: 'Road To Antalya' Race walking meeting, 27 March – Warsaw

Olga Chojecka showed a very good performance at Bielany. From the start, she built a clear advantage over **Katarzyna Zdziebło.** Walking at an even and strong pace, the athlete from Siedlee finally finished with a time of **43:55.80**. This is her personal record and the third best result in the history of Polish athletics. The second finish line was crossed by Zdziebło, who was unable to fight Chojecka throughout the entire distance. At the finish line she achieved a result of **44:08.43**.

In the men's competition, the pace was initially set by three players - Maher Ben Hlima, Artur Brzozowski and Dawid Tomala. The third of these competitors was eliminated from the competition for the top position the fastest. Meanwhile, Brzozowski was closely behind Ben Hlima for a long time, but in the second part of the distance the Łódź resident jumped away from his experienced rival and finished over half a minute ahead of him. At the finish line he achieved a time of 39:32.63. Brzozowski was second with a result of 40:08.64. Tomala finished third (41:54.19).

ITALY: Italian Race Walking Club championships (Round #2), 24 March - Campobasso

Fortunato stands out in Campobasso

In the 10,000 meter walk of the second round of the Race Walking Club Championship, held on the 24th of March in the Italian city of Campobasso, the main protagonist of the day was Francesco Fortunato who won with a time of 38:51.71, a personal record by 9 seconds (before: 39:00.79, in 2019) just a few seconds away from the national record, a season that is proving to be triumphant, after his titles in the 5,000 meter indoor walk and the 20 km on the road.

The championship was a good test for several of the best Italian walkers who will represent the Italian team at the World Team Walking Championships, taking place in the Turkish city of Antalya, in just under a month. Gianluca Picchiottino also stood out with another great personal record: 38:57.96, following the one he achieved a week earlier, in Dudince, with a personal record (1:21:47) in the 20 km. Andrea Agrusti, still in the same race, was third with a time of 40:43.72.

For Fortunato and others, the next test is in Podebrady, on the excellent circuit that has hosted the European Team Championships and where Fortunato himself has good memories, as it was there, last year, that he broke his personal record with a mark of 1:18:59 and that can definitely launch it, without forgetting Antalya, for the European Championships in Rome and the Olympic Games in Paris.

In the women's sector (10,000m), as expected, Alexandrina Mihai gave her competition no chance, winning with a time of 46:54.01. In the remaining places on the podium were Lucia Barbarossa (48:14.08) and Verdiana Casciotti (48:28.85).

Still in the women's race, now in the Under-20s*, what stands out is the time of 47:01.48 obtained by Michelle Cantò, a personal record and minimums largely surpassed for the World Championships in the category, which will take place in Cali, which also was achieved by Elisa Marini (48:57.04). Alessandra Cosi was third with 51:25.09.

In the men's Under-20s*, unsurprisingly, victory for Giuseppe Disabato, silver medal in the Under-18 European Championships (2022) and bronze medal in the Under-20 European Championships (2023), who ran a time of 42:37.91. Andrea Di Carlo with 43:45.04 and Omar Moretti with 44:23.88, accompanied him on the podium, setting personal records.
