There's often something quite stimulating about an unfamiliar racing course, something that makes you want to stretch out and be adventurous. Last Sunday, the Victoria Park circuit in Ballarat provided such a stimulus (even if it was just to get warm!) for **Andrew Jamieson**, co-winner of this week's WOTW.

Andrew, 75, walked a superb race to take silver in the AV Men's 40+ 10km title. Andy's time of **58:31** gave him an age grading of **94.02%**. There just seems to be no way of slowing him down, much less stopping him!

Meanwhile, south of Bass Strait (probably no colder than Ballarat), 16yo Hobart walker **Will Bottle** tried his hand at 10kms for the first time, with nobody to push him but the clock. On a 5km loop circuit, Will strode away to finish in an excellent time of **49:32**. Will has excellent potential, and we hope to see him at Middle Park in September – and perhaps in Canberra – for the RWA Federation events and championships.



Well done, Andy and Will ... and all the best for the rest of the Winter season.

- Mark Blackwood winner of the C H Bert Gardiner medal in taking the AV 10km 40+ title, with a great time of 48:18.
- Heather Carr runner-up in the Women's 50+ AV 10km championship in 1:08:42. This gave Heather, 72, an age grading of 89.79%. Impressive!
- Ela Uzun winner of the VRWC U14 3km title with a Club record of 14:49, setting a 9sec PB in the process.

AV 10km Open, 40+, 50+ & AV Country c'ships, Sunday 1 May – Victoria Park, Ballarat

For the first time in many years AV road walking action returned to regional Victoria, extending the sport's profile beyond Melbourne and giving our members the opportunity to race in interesting new surroundings. Close cooperation between the VRWC and the Ballarat Race Walking Club enabled a very successful carnival to be staged at the picturesque Victoria Park venue. While fields were small across the various championships, the feedback from walkers and supporters was that the course was excellent, the venue very appealing and the BBQ sausages even better!

Conditions were chilly but still - pretty much ideal once you warmed up. The 10km races (AV and club non-championship) got proceedings underway with **Mark Blackwood** going out hard and never being headed for a good win in **48:18**, earning him the AV Open and 40+ titles as well as the Bert Gardiner medal. **Andrew Jamieson** added yet another record – this time the Australian 70+ 10km – to his impressive resume in taking 2<sup>nd</sup> behind Mark. **Jemma Peart** took out the Women's Open and Country 10km titles with **54:21** ahead of Ballarat YCW team mate **Sarah Brennan**, whose **55:43** earned her two silvers as well as the Women's 40+ title.

**Carolyn Rosenbrock** showed glimpses of her form of a few years ago, winning the Women's 50+ title in 1:01:49, with **Heather Carr** and **Donna-Marie Elms** claiming the minor medals.

Marcus Wakim, competing by invitation in the U18 race, posted the fastest 5km of the day with 22:39. Ballarat YCW's younger brigade cleaned up the junior Country titles through Alanna Peart, Fraser Saunder, Scott Peart (5km) and Charlotte McDonell (3km). It was pleasing also to have young Tasmanian Sam Lindsay join us to contest the U16 3km by invitation, after a summer of strong racing. Sam's 14:39 shows he's ready for a good road season.

As usual, accompanying the AV championships were our own Club age group titles and Open non-championship races. Our young country members competed in these simultaneously to their AV races.

**Riley Coughlan** was the fastest of the 5km contenders with a brisk **23:32**, while **Ela Uzun** continues to remake the record book in her image, this time returning an excellent **14:49** to take the U14 3km title and break her own U12 road mark. Surprisingly, **Julia Baldy** hadn't raced over 1km before, but her attacking effort to win the U10 championship in **5:40** indicates she'll be cutting that down substantially this season.

Another surprise on the day came from new member **Alejandro Stephens**. Prior to Sunday Alejandro had raced no further than 3km in 19:18, so his first 10km race in **59:09** came as a real eye opener and augurs well for a good winter. It was encouraging to see three young newcomers in **Eva Reid** (3km in a promising 18:09), her sister **Sienna** and **Zoe Bowkett** race with us for the first time, and we hope to see a lot more of them.

# AUSTRALIAN TEAM FOR OCEANIA ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS ANNOUNCED

Team Australia is gearing up for its fourth of seven international Championships this year, as Athletics Australia announces its strongest ever team selected for the Oceania Athletics Championships taking place in Mackay, QLD from 7-11 June.

25 Olympians, including Tokyo top-8 finisher and Commonwealth Games gold medallist **Jemima Montag**, and 16 Paralympians including Commonwealth Games medal hopefuls **Sarah Edmiston and Evan O'Hanlon**, will headline the contingent of 335, with many using the meet as an opportunity to finesse their preparations for the Oregon 2022 World Athletics Championships and Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games.

Without a World Para Athletics Championships occurring this year, the home Championships will also serve as an important stepping-stone in the lead up to next year's World Para Athletics Championships in Paris, and the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.

Almost 200 juniors will join Australia's elite, competing across both Under 20 and Under 18 events, as they build towards the World Under 20 Championships in Cali. For many fresh-faced Australian representatives, this will also serve as an opportunity to lay down their foundations as they work towards selection for future Australian teams.

Athletics Australia General Manager, Andrew Faichney said the team announced, as per the Athletics Australia selection policy, will be primed for tough competition, with the high scoring meet crucial in determining the Australian team travelling to Oregon and Birmingham.

"An Area Championships is an important competition for any athlete and to be Oceania Champion is great recognition. The Oceania Athletics Championships are also the highest level competition to score world ranking points in our Area. As such, it's an extremely important competition for our athletes, and as such we have selected a very strong Australian team for the Area Championships," Faichney said.

"The ranking points accrued from these Championships carry over for two years, meaning that competition is set to be fiercer than ever in Mackay, as athletes look to be selected for the Australian team travelling to Oregon and begin their journey to Paris. It will also be a chance to impress selectors before the end of the Commonwealth Games qualifying period.

"We're looking forward to seeing this mix of youth and experience put their best foot forward in what is set to be one of the most competitive meets in the region for many years."

RWA 35km TEAMS CHALLENGE, Sunday 15 May - Fawkner Park

As part of the AA 35km Road Championship on Sunday 15 May, notice is given that a **Teams Challenge** will take place over the 35km distance. Details of this event are as follows:

## Race Walking Australia 35km Team Challenge

- Athletes must enter and meet the entry rules (including entry standard) for the Australian and Oceania 35km Race Walking Championships before entering the RWA 35km Team Challenge. You cannot enter the team challenge unless you have entered individually before the close off date.
- Teams of 3 or more athletes, up to five, points are awarded for the best 3 performances and the team with highest (or lowest) wins, same as WWTC. All Team members will be awarded RWA medals/trophy, regardless of finish status.
- Teams can be mixed.
- Teams can be geographically based, coach-based, state-based, beer flavor-based, dog breed, colour...... anything.
- Entries must be made on the AA portal, teams are self-organising after event entry.
- Race Walking Australia will collate and advertise teams via its website, each team should nominate a manager and communication will be between RWA and the team. Teams must advise secretary@rwa.org.au before 8<sup>th</sup> May
- Team placing will have no bearing on the individual placing and there is NO correlation between them.
- Individual entries do not have to join a team.

# INTERNATIONAL NEWS

#### UNITED KINGDOM: British Grand Prix of Race Walking 2022, 29 April - Leeds

Our favourite race walking journeyman, Emmanuel Tardi, was on hand with his paddles at Leeds in North Yorkshire. Here is his report:

I was appointed as judge last Saturday in Leeds for the Great Britain National championship (20k for men and women, 10k for juniors.)

The race took place in Leeds (in the center of the country) on a perfect road which is usually used for cycling races - perfect asphalt and totally flat. Each loop was 1km long. All races were scheduled at 6pm. Unfortunately, there was only a few starters (4 men and 3 women in main events).

Immediately after the gun, **Tom Bosworth, Cameron Corbishley** and **Guy Thomas** led the race. Thomas was later disqualified, Corbishley decelerated and Bosworth stayed alone in front of the pack. He won the race easily.

In 10k, **Heather Lewis** produced a strong **44:56.0**, while in the Women's 20k, it was a very easy victory for **Bethan Davies**, one week after her Dudince race where she produced a 35k in 2h58.
