**** WALKER OF THE WEEK ****



It was yet another week in which top-quality walking performances abounded, with the focus being on Sydney (Australian T&F championships) and Brisbane (AMA T&F championships.) The talent on display ranged from up-and-coming juniors, through established elite internationals to inspirational veterans who, while at the other end of their athletic careers, are still showing us how to squeeze every drop from every opportunity.

It's to one of these invincibles that this week's WOTW is presented. **Andrew Jamieson** (VIC) has taken the award with three Gold medals in the M75 section (no surprises there) in Brisbane. What is noteworthy is that, at age 75, each of Andrew's times ranks him where he has been for the past two decades – at or around the top of the world masters lists:

- 1500m 8:08.77 (Åge grading 94.46%)
- 5000m 29:07.50 (Age grading 91.79%)
- 10km road 1:00:26.0 (Age grading 91.04%)

In addition, Andrew's finish placings across all age groups in Brisbane make impressive reading: - 1500m (6th out of 13); 5000m (7th out of 13); 10km road (5th out of 12)

Congratulations, Andy! Yours is a glow for young and old to bask in ... and recharge with!

Honourable mentions:

- Ignacio Jiminez Solis (QLD) ... easily the fastest walker at the Masters titles, with times placing him around the 90% age groupings for M55.
- Jemima Montag (VIC) and Olivia Sandery (SA) ... both breakers of meet records in winning their respective 10,000m titles.
- Kyle Swan (VIC) ... took the lead from the gun in the Men's Open 10,000m title and nearly lapped the field on his way to a sub-40min win.
- Owen Toyne (ACT) ... backing up to take the U18 5000m title (still aged 14), following his U16 3000m win of last week.



AROUND THE COUNTRY



AUST. T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS, 26 MAR-3 APR – OLYMPIC PARK, SYDNEY

Sydney continued to be hammered by driving rain and cold winds during the week, putting fast times out of the reach of many, though by no means all. One does not often see winter road season conditions in a summer track championship, and this might have been an eye-opener for spectators unfamiliar with the all-weather, all-year-round aspect of race walking.

The live streaming of competition days provided impressive coverage of not only all the walks but of the conditions in which they were raced. The walkers who contested the 10,000m and 5,000m championships on the Wednesday, Thursday and Friday all deserve commendation for their efforts and the showcase of our sport they provided.

** Wednesday 30 March – Session 8

For sheer dominance, it's hard to go past the displays of both **Jemima Montag** and **Kyle Swan** in the Open 10,000m titles. (To those two could be added **Olivia Sandery**, who lapped a quality field in the U20 race to break the Meet record.)

Following is a detailed race summary from AA's *Lachlan Moorhouse* and *Sascha Ryner*, re-printed below from the *Athletics Australia* website:

Victorians Jemima Montag and Kyle Swan have all but booked their tickets to Birmingham after securing automatic nomination for the Commonwealth Games team at the 2022 Chemist Warehouse Australian Track and Field Championships this evening. Montag won the Australian women's 10,000m race walking title in a swift 43:02.97 – comfortably under the qualifying standard for Birmingham and is now set to defend her gold medal this August. She also became the first Australian track and field athlete to be nominated to Commonwealth Games Australia for the UK campaign.

The 24-year-old medical student was tactical in her approach, staying tucked up behind eventual silver and bronze medal winners **Katie Hayward** (QLD, **44:28.80**) and **Rebecca Henderson** (VIC, **44:40.09**), but with 13 laps to go, Montag made a gutsy move to push past the duo to make a bid for nomination.

Winning by daylight, Montag crossed the line in a meet record of 43:02.97, in front of Henderson and Hayward. Hayward too met the qualifying standard for Birmingham.

"It feels really good to tick off this business trip and get the win to go to Birmingham. I've now got a few months to really knuckle down and concentrate on training," Montag said.

"Four years ago, I had a special moment on the Gold Coast, and it was a turning point in my walking career in terms of self-belief and what I've dreamt could be possible, so it feels exciting that we are maybe one step closer to reliving that," Montag said.

Though Swan wasn't able to dip under the qualifying standard of 39:30.00 tonight, a previous qualifying time coupled with the 2022 Australian 10,000m Race Walk title will guarantee his spot on the Australian team. Swan, the favourite to win the title tonight, commanded the event, finishing in **39:55.17** and one minute and 21 seconds in front of second-place getter 19-year-old **Will Thompson** (41:17.05) and New Zealand's **Quentin Rew** (41:46.41).

"I'm really happy with that tonight. I got the auto qualifying time back in January and have cemented that in tonight," Swan said.

"It was windy out there, so not great conditions, but I'm happy with my form. It's going to be a really long season and I've got to make sure I'm healthy when I get to the start line in August."

Olivia Sandery won the Women's Under 20 10,000m race walk in **45:28.96** to set a new meet record to secure her place on the Australian Under 20 team heading to the Cali 2022 World Athletics Under 20 Championships. **Fraser Saunder** won the men's event in **47:15.49**.

** Thursday 31 March – Session 10

The girls got no help from the weather as **Milly Boughton** (NSW) set a cracking pace with a 1:38 first lap. She was soon joined, however, by **Alexandra Griffin** (WA) and **Jayda Anderson** (QLD), who led at 1km in 4:34. The lead pack stayed together until Griffin opened a gap at half-way and never relinquished it, going on to win convincingly in **24:03.15** to give her the U18 title ahead of **Zoe Woods** (NSW), who came within 15secs of a 3000m/5000m double with her **24:18.53**. **Nellie Langford** (SA) and the gutsy Anderson had a solid battle for the bronze, with the South Aussie just prevailing in **24:36.10**.

Boughton, despite half a minute in the 'sin bin', had enough time in hand to hold off **Maddison Nash** (VIC) to win the U17 title in **26:03.54** to Nash's **26:14.40**, while a 3:39 PB for bronze in **26:32.48** stamps **Aiva Pinches** (NSW) as one definitely to watch in the future.

** Friday 1 April – Session 12

The final walks of the meet saw the U17 and U18 5000m boys slogging through the worst of the conditions, all finishers producing meritorious efforts as the girls had the day before. **Marcus Wakim** (VIC) led from the start with a first lap of 1:35, being joined at 2km by **Owen Toyne** (ACT), **Will Bottle** (TAS), **John Ronan** (WA), **Kodi Clarkson** (ACT) and **Riley Coughlan** (VIC). Wakim and Toyne swapped the lead until 3km when the Victorian U20 international rep took control, pulling away for the U17 title win in **21:56.98**. Wakim was unfazed by the weather, recording consistent 1km splits of 4:24, 4:24, 4:26, 4:24 and 4:18. Toyne claimed his second title of the meet in the U18 section, finishing in a 1:01 PB time of **21:59.30**, while Coughlan's silver in **22:24.19** came on the back of a huge 1:26 PB! Bottle claimed a well-earned bronze in **22:58.96**.

Clarkson's 22:39.92 (an 18sec PB) and a 23:30.07 by Sam McCure (QLD, PB 0:10) secured them the minor U17 medals.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

CZECH REPUBLIC: WA Race Walking Tour Gold meeting, Saturday 2 April - Podebrady

Emmanuel Tardi reports from Podebrady in the Czech Republic, where he was a judge at the 90th anniversary edition of this classic international race walking meet.



It was a very cold day this Saturday in Podebrady (east of Prague). But there was no wind, and it was a good weather for walkers. After the masters and youth races in the morning, the two main races were scheduled at 1pm (20k women) and 3pm (20k men).

In the women's event, the race was led by Maria Perez (ESP, European champion), Johanna Ordonez (ECU), Valeria Ortuno (MEX) and Saskia Feige (GER). Maria Perez received her 3rd red card and was stopped in the penalty area, then was disqualified. Then Ortuno leaded the race for a few metres. After one hour, she became the leader with a larger gap. And she won the race.

In the men's event, there was a big pack walking 4min per kilometer. The final winner, Caio Bonfim (BRA), was not in this group and caught it after 5k. He became the leader with a gap around the 14k point. He produced a final 5k in 19:27 and won the race with huge 1h18.54.
