- I am pleased to announce that the RW U23 award winners for 2023-24 are **Char Hay** and **Marcus Wakim.**The Committee's voting recognises the commitment of both these young walkers to the sport and to their progress in it. The two successful nominees will be presented with their awards by Neil Ryan of Runners World Sports store, this coming Sunday at Middle Park as part of the AV Winter Trophy presentations.

 Congratulations, Char and Marcus! An honour well deserved.
- I was informed by VMA statistician Clyde Riddoch a couple of weeks back that both **Bob Gardiner** and **Kelly Ruddick** had lowered records in the weekend of October 19/20. **Bob**, aged 88, finished the AVSL 2000m in **15:11.6**, a time that smashed his own Australian and State M85 record of 16:03.0. **Kelly**, for her part, reduced her own Victorian W50 mark by 27 secs for a new time of **1:19:08** at our recent Middle Park road event. Needless to say, both performances will be new VRWC records as well.

Well done, Bob and Kelly. Apologies for missing them earlier. And thanks, Clyde.

*Now ... an important announcement from Race Director Mark Donahoo:

*This could be a job for you!

RACE SECRETARY

The role of the Race secretary is to ensure walkers are prepared to race in the events of the day.

In order to this the race secretary will:

- 1. Have on the check-in table the following:
 - Race sheets for the events, check-in sheets with names of entries obtained from the Race Director.
 - Information sheet for the event with the event distances, times, age groups stated, colour ribbons to be worn and details of the next race, obtained from the race Director
 - · Colour ribbons for walkers to wear, pins
 - Blue folders for the race sheets
 - Spare numbers for those who do not have a race number
 - VRWC numbers for new members or those who need a new number.
- 2. As walkers arrive,
 - Check their names, bib number and race distance.
 - Make changes to the race sheet if needed
 - Ask the walker to collect the correct colour ribbon
 - Collect race fees if they have not paid

- 3. If a walker has not entered a race, add their name to the race check in sheet and record any entry fee paid.
- 4. Readjust the race sheets with any changes or additions from the check in sheet.
- 5. Record on the check in sheet any additional payments made by the walker or their family, such as uniforms.
- 6. Have access to the 'SQUARE' terminal to receive payments on the day.
- 7. 10 minutes before races, have the race sheets and the ribbons for these races, taken to the start line.
- 8. At the completion of the races, put the numbers, ribbons, folders, pins back in the secretary office.
- 9. Collect the sheets from the blue folders and pass these onto the race director or person who will type up the results.

We ask our non-racing (or part-time racing) members to consider trying their hand at this essential race day job. It may sound like a lot but, with practice, much of it will become automatic. Many hands make light work, so if more than one person is interested, the job can be rostered over the season. Mark and Stu will be happy to assist whenever help is needed.

** WALKER OF THE WEEK **







All Schools championship action was on view coast to coast at the weekend, namely, in Perth, Melbourne, Hobart and Brisbane. The QLD walkers did it tougher, thanks to brutal heat on the day, so it's noteworthy that **Milly Sharpe** and **Olivia Boulton (QLD)** both set new championship records, a fact we acknowledge here by awarding both girls this issue's WOTW alongside Australian walking legend, **Bob Gardiner (VIC)**.

Olivia, contesting the U16 3000m title in a mixed-age field, won in 15:53.14, a time she would no doubt have smashed in more favourable conditions considering her PB of 15:12 at the recent QRSS championships. Milly, starting the 5000m later with the temperature soaring, took nearly a full minute longer to win the U17 title than she had in her corresponding QRSS race, clocking 25:57.43 against her PB of 24:58 back then. Slower as they might have been, however, both girls were good enough to set new benchmarks for their state's school-age walkers. In addition, both showed the impressive level of their progress into the mid-teen ranks in that they could still produce strong results in the debilitating Brisbane heat.

Bob's award is a retrospective one. As mentioned in VRWC *Member News* above, I found out a couple of weeks ago about Bob's great 2000m result in AVSL Round 3, where he set new Australian and Victorian M85 records with his time of **15:11.6.** However, things get missed if you don't jot them down, so it's another case of 'better late than never'. Sorry, mate.

At age 88, Bob, who represented his country at both the 1964 and 1968 Olympics and won silver at the 1970 Commonwealth Games, is still motivated to pull on his beloved Collingwood Harriers vest and compete in summer track competition when time and health permit. He has maintained his fitness level admirably and his signature technique is still working well for him, if the stride has shortened somewhat. And you will still see him in an official capacity, assisting with VRWC events at Middle Park on most racing weekends.

Well done, Olivia, Milly and Bob. We wish you all a productive summer of racing!

- **John Ronan (WA)** continued his welcome return to top form with a powerful performance in the WA All Schools U18 5000m, winning in 20:28.02 which is only 13secs slower than the 20:15 PB he set in February.
- Bethany Moore-Kirkland, Noah Cooke and Isabella Welch (QLD) three more who withstood the heat at the QLD All Schools for strong wins, in times not a million miles slower than their PBs.

GERMANY: Lusatian International Race Walk meeting, 26 October – Zittau

The 3rd Lusatian International Race walk Festival (World Athletics Bronze) saw over 200 entrants across a wide range of distances and age groups converge on the city of Zittau. The feature event was the 35km, with at least two countries (Great Britain and Czechia) using the event as their national championships. It was a double strike for Poland, with Maher Ben Hlima and Katarzyna Zdzieblo scoring good wins ahead of Cameron Corbishley (GBR) and Sandra Lorena Arenas (COL) respectively.

The course would be held in Melbourne and would probably be a half-day course which would include both theory and practical elements.

The course would cover the areas of:

- Racewalking Rule
- Racewalking technique
- · Exercises for racewalkers
- Setting basic programs for walkers of all ages, including peaking and rest phases.
- Training techniques
- Other topics may be included

As a beginning for to this process, Mark is asking for anyone who is interested in attending a racewalk coaching course to contact him via email. The email does not lock anyone into doing the course but is to be used as a way of finding out if there is much interest in the course. There is no date or time set for a course yet.

Spread the word amongst those who are racewalking. The more interest shown, the better the opportunity will be to conduct this course.

Not all who hold the rights to such material are willing to allow re-printing elsewhere, even in a not-for-profit publication like 'H&T Online' – although most race walking organisations and club publications are happy to allow re-use of articles and photos in a similar club newsletter or blog, provided they are given appropriate credit.

With your submission, always include the provenance (writer, creator, source publication, date of publication, website link etc). If in doubt about permissibility, check with the owner of the copyright.
