**** WALKER OF THE WEEK ****



No need to look far this week. Bec Henderson is the hands-down winner of this issue's WOTW following her outstanding 35km debut and maiden senior Australian title in atrocious conditions at Fawkner Park on Sunday.

Starting briskly with an eye on a Budapest qualifier, Bec was on track until 22km when she hit a bad patch and slowed, but held form and a slender advantage over Hong Kong's Siu Nga Ching to record 3:01:38, an excellent time in the heat.

"It was a bit annoying that today had to be the hottest day in however long, but that's alright. We can improve and look ahead to the next one," Bec said in a post-race interview with AA*. "I am still looking for those qualifiers for Budapest and Paris so it's going to be a big 18 months."

Congratulations, Bec. It was stirring stuff to see you grinding it out with such determination, and we wish you every success in the ongoing hunt for that qualifying time.

*Honourable mentions

- Rhydian Cowley (VIC) winner of the Australian 35km championship in 2:37:30, with a master class of pace judgement in sapping heat.
- Sam Findlay and Kim Mottrom (SA) Sam for her 3min-plus PB on a day nobody else could get close to theirs, and Kim for demonstrating once again how to endure over a long distance, this time in hot conditions.
- Olivia Sandery (SA) wore down Birmingham CG rep Katie Hayward to win the Open 20km in her second race over the distance.
- Allanah Pitcher (NSW) a fine display in her first-ever 20km in 1:42:36, which would possibly have been sub 1:40 in the same conditions she'd trained in.
- Will Thompson (VIC) a doubtful starter owing to a lower arm fracture, Will dismissed the pain – and his opposition – to win the men's 20km easily in 1:32:46.

Sunday 4 December, Fawkner Park

COWLEY, HENDERSON PREVAIL AS HEAT WREAKS HAVOC

After weeks of *La Nina*-driven wintry weather in which all local walkers had trained leading up to this meet, a two-day window of blast-furnace summer heat arrived at Fawkner Park – right on cue to dash any hopes of qualifying times for upcoming international meets – before the return of *faux*-winter the very next day.

If Spielberg had written it as a freshman screenplay assignment he'd have got an 'F'. As has been heard often over the past twelve months, you couldn't make this stuff up. (At least on this occasion, politicians weren't to blame.)

35 Kilometers Australian championships

Under the circumstances, getting four finishers home from the 9 starters in the 35km was pretty good. It was hardly surprising that, of those four, two were 50km men and one a triathlete with experience at enduring in a range of weathers and environments.

Rhydian Cowley defended his national title with solid result of **2:37.30**, measuring his output over the 17.5 laps to ensure a strong finish. **Bec Henderson** – having been helped with a fast start by Jemima Montag – ground through the tough final 10km with sound technique and gritty determination against the lactic tide, to win the Women's title in **3:01:38** – a time that would have been substantially below 3 hours had conditions been better.

Henderson had an added incentive over those last tortuous kilometres, in the form of Hong Kong visitor **Siu Nga Ching**. Siu (known also as Jessica) walked a determined race in an effort to reel Bec in towards the end. She adjusted well to the conditions and her time of **3:02:20** was an impressive result. Final finisher was SA Masters walker **Kim Mottrom**, the Swiss Army knife of Australian walking (there's a Centurion badge waiting up ahead, surely), who made his second 35km national podium in 12 months with a gutsy walk to record **3:12:08**, showing a sound, economical technique throughout.

A combination of the heat and Covid recovery conspired to prevent others from finishing, and with Budapest on the horizon it's hoped other opportunities will soon be forthcoming as the quest for qualifying times continues.

The heat was as pitiless for the 14 competitors here as for those in the 35km, with personal goals shrivelling as the race turned into one simply to get through. There were, however, several notable results.

Olivia Sandery and Katie Hayward provided the best contest with a mere 23secs separating them at the finish, Olivia winning in 1:36:35 to cap off a wonderful year. Allanah Pitcher handled the conditions admirably in her first 20kms for third in 1:42:36, while perhaps the biggest surprise came from Sam Findlay whose 1:44:10 was a 3:09 PB ... an astonishing result 'against the tide'.

Will Thompson wasn't about to let a broken arm stop his participation and, while naturally fighting pain, he still stamped his authority upon the men's field to win by over three minutes in 1:32:46 from Dylan Richardson.

BRITISH ATHLETICS TO AXE TRACK WALKS?

Tom Boswell has stated, in a post on the FB page *Race Walking Group*, that British Athletics has made a behind-closed-doors decision to remove walking races from future British outdoor and indoor track championships.

While no formal announcement appears yet to have been made, the information (presumably leaked) is disturbing for all who love the sport and revere its heritage, both in UK athletics and as a component of track and field worldwide. Once abolished, what are the chances of reinstating it? No doubt discussion will centre on whether the British race walking community can mount a sufficiently strong challenge to have this decision overturned. The consequences for the sport of shutting down such a vital developmental outlet for young talent aiming at international representation need no spelling out here.

If Great Britain ceases to recognize race walking – a sport in which it was a 20^{th} century powerhouse – as worthy of a place alongside other athletics events, the sport will be lost to potential stars there who were born to do it yet will likely never know of it.
