****WALKER OF THE WEEK****



It's another joint WOTW this time around, with **Will Thompson** and **Angus Shuttleworth (VIC)** sharing the honours on the basis of breakthrough performances at last Sunday's AV road walk championships.

Will's winning 20km performance, producing his inaugural sub 1:20:00 time with 1:19:56, is the latest in a series of results that herald a career on the rise. With two big internationals – the World University Games and WA World Athletics championships – approaching, Will has followed a measured training build-up and appears ready to peak at his chosen time. His display on Sunday was a dominant one, showing him to be well-equipped to take on the world best.

We've seen little of **Angus** at Middle Park so far this winter, but he's obviously made good use of his training time. Three big PB performances over 3km (Canberra), 2km (LAVic titles) and 5km (Club points) turned out to be the lead-up to what must be his best result since joining the VRWC

- a new U14 Club record for 5km of **23:23** which tore 1:28 from the time he set a fortnight ago. Angus will now have his sights set on the AA Road championships in August, and we hope he is able to maintain and build on his form for another great result in Ballarat.

Congratulations, Will and Angus, and all the best for the races to come.

*Honourable mentions

- Alejandro Stephens (VIC) came away from Middle Park with his first sub-1:40:00 20km and four other PBs to boot.
- Ela Uzun (VIC) but for a timekeeping 'technical' would have had yet another Australian record after blitzing 5km in 23:05, for a 27 sec PB and a new Club record.
- Havana Ali (VIC) one of the day's big improvers, stripping 1:15 from her 5km PB in clocking 27:10.
- Jia Wen Heng (VIC) a valiant and successful first attempt over the tough 20km distance.
- Elsie Woodward (TAS) a steady improver, Elsie took 12 secs from her 1km time on this occasion and should soon go under 6:00.

CLUB NEWS and RESULTS

VRWC AV, VMA & VRWC 20km & Age group Championships, 6 July – Middle Park

A pleasant, wind-free winter Sunday morning greeted the 51 starters who lined up for the AV, VMA and VRWC Winter road championships. Spared the icy gale that impacted the previous AV and Little Aths titles, the Aughtie Drive loop provided its usual opportunities for fast times and many excellent results were achieved.



20 laps to go!

Will Thompson had the perfect send-off for the World Uni Games in Bochum (GER), winning the Men's AV 20km and the VRWC *Ray Smith Trophy* with a negative split PB of 1:19:56, his first result below 80 minutes. Facing elite opposition in Germany in a few weeks, he couldn't be better prepared. Will had his work cut out shaking off the ever-determined **Rhydian** Cowley, who finished 9 secs ahead of **Kyle Swan** for silver in 1:20:30. Kyle built a long lead from the gun and was on track to give his PB a nudge at 10km, only surrendering the lead in the last 5km to take bronze in 1:20:39.

For Alejandro Stephens it was a productive morning, setting PBs at 8, 10, 12 and 15km en route to his long-awaited first sub-100min result of 1:38:37. Marcus Wakim also joined the PB party, sneaking past the bouncers with a 5 sec

improvement, while QLD's Sam McCure would have got in as well but for three of those pesky red tickets. Next time, Sam!

Alanna Peart, now resident in Adelaide and competing by invitation, started conservatively in the women's 20km before hit stepping up a gear for her own negative split result of 1:35:47, just shy of the PB she set in February, earning her the VRWC *Elsie Jacobson Trophy*. Allanah's SA club mate Nellie Langford had to tough it out over the last 8km but her 1:42:13 missed her own PB by less than half a minute. Of the AV contestants, Carolyn Rosenbrock's 2:07:43 won her four titles: AV, VMA, VRWC and VRWC Masters – a fine reward for leaving a warm doona on a Sunday! Mentone's Jia Wen Heng's lack of distance experience did not overcome a sound technique and a sensible approach that saw her successfully complete her first 20km.

Terry O'Neill felt confident enough to tackle another Masters 20 and was vindicated, walking a well-paced race for the Men's VMA gold.

Also noteworthy was Havana Ali who clocked a huge 1:17 PB with her 27:09 for silver behind cousin Ela.

Wins to **Tate McQueen** and **Alaska Bremner** in the U14 3km, with times of **16:00** and **16:34**, continued a fruitful winter for both these country youngsters, and we hope to see as much of them as travel time will permit in the remaining months. The 3km results were a PB harvest, with four of the 6 finishers setting new bests.

The **Intervals race** is another of our popular 'special' races – in fact it's a mixture of race and speed training session. There are several approaches, including setting one's own pace goals and lap target times, or going out hard and hanging on for as long as you can.

In the Intervals Race, walkers choose to walk either **6km**, **8km** or **10km** in 2km intervals.

To walk in this event, you must be able to complete each leg in **less than 17 minutes**. If, for example, you walk 11.30min for the 1st leg, you have 5.30min rest before starting the next leg. If a walker fails to finish any leg in the allowable 17 minutes, he/she will not be allowed to continue.

The start times for the 2km legs are as follows:

Your 2km repetition times will be added to give you your final aggregate time for the race distance you complete.

If you prefer a scratch race instead, 2km and 3km are on offer.

- A retired athlete who has competed at an international level
- A coach who has coached athletes to an international level
- An international level official

• An event group expert, for example a performance support provider (e.g. therapist, scientist etc) that has supported a specific Event Group athlete/coach's senior Championship preparation.

DOGS OFF LEASH

At our championships day on Sunday 18 May, one of our race judges had cause to lodge a formal report concerning several dogs whose owners had seen fit to let them run untethered in a 'KEEP DOGS ON LEASH' area, very close to the northern turn of our course. At least one dog had been free to roam onto the path itself.

There is official signage on the path next to the Bowling Club fence in that area, requiring that dogs be kept on leash. Whether it was unseen or ignored by the dog owners, it resulted in a safety risk and was a source of anxiety for our competitors. The incident was reported to Parks Victoria, who will advise their rostered rangers to patrol the area and undertake dog education measures if necessary.

VRWC members, supporters and parents who notice similar incidents should notify myself, Mark Donahoo or Terry Swan.

Below are the current fees as of 1st April 2025: Senior (Open and Masters) \$30.00 Under 20: \$25.00 Under 16: \$15.00 Associate (Officials who assist with races throughout the year): \$ 0.00 Family membership: \$50.00 Annual Subscriptions are due on April 1st of each calendar year. Inner metro and outside ring metro members pay full fees. Country members, pay 50% of the annual fee. (The outside ring of metropolitan councils are: Wyndham, Melton, Hume, Whittlesea, Nillumbik, Yarra Ranges, Cardinia, Casey, and the Mornington peninsula down to Mornington. Outside of these areas are considered country area.)

*UNIFORMS - Remember also that all competing members are required to wear the current Club **racing uniform** (singlet, racing top or crop top), in order to be eligible for Time or Handicap points and to race in Club championships. The cost of each item is \$45. (Families: \$45 for the first child, \$35 for siblings.)
