WALKER OF THE WEEK



This week's WOTW award heads in a westerly direction, stopping in Adelaide to honour **Sebastian Richards** and **Liam Freundt (SA)** following impressive performances at ASA's interclub opening round at Mile End stadium last Saturday.

Sebastian, 17, got his season off to a rocketing start with an 18sec PB over 3000m that saw him clock **12:29.51**, stamping himself as a definite podium prospect for the national All Schools championships in Melbourne if he's there. If not, he'll be gearing up for more eyecatching results in the later major events of the summer.

Liam, 16, earned his share of the award with a thumping 1:13 PB time of 13:35.40 in the same race. An improvement of this nature is not only 'new level' but also usually a huge confidence booster, and we look forward to seeing further reduction in Liam's times as the season progresses towards championship time.

Well done, Sebastian and Liam. Great results for hard work.



*Honourable mentions:

- Kim Mottrom (SA) another State M40 record for his collection, with a 3000m time of 12:45.86. Still plenty of speed
 in that wiry frame!
- Isaac Beacroft (NSW) A sub-20min 5000m usually rates higher than an honourable, but Isaac is making a habit of this sort of thing! Lucky spectators at ANSW's Treloar Shield comp were treated to something special on Saturday as Isaac whipped around the 12.5 laps in 19:51.45.
- Michelle Bray (ACT) showed the fruits of a solid winter season with a 44 sec PB over 2000m in the ACTRWFC summer opener, clocking 9:39.
- Lily Lambert (VIC) took 1:30 from her best over 2000m to clock 10:56.51 at AVSL, confirming her improvement over the winter.
- Eva Parker (TAS, 15y) successfully completed her first 10km race, breaking the hour with 59:41.

'It was great to take part in a sustainability day event at the 2025 World Athletics Championships in Tokyo alongside the **Athlete Refugee Team (ART)**. The ART was founded in 2016 for the Rio Olympics, and is the world's only year-round full-time refugee team programme. It is composed of athletes who have fled violence, conflict and injustice at home, and its members are supported by @worldathletics. The ART is a part of World Athletics' broader Athletics for a Better World Programme, along with their sustainability and safeguarding initiatives. I've been a fan of the ART for some time, so it was wonderful to meet and work together with the athletes and coach for the first time. I hope the spectators who joined the session also enjoyed it.'



'During an end of season holiday, I made a school visit. Two years ago, with the connection made by @ecoathletesteam, I took part in a virtual Green Sports Day summit with Hamamatsu Kaiseikan High School, supporting their students' exploration of how climate change and sport intersect. Having kept in touch, it was nice to find time while in Japan to visit and meet those same students and teachers in person, and explore that topic further. I even got to meet the principal. This was my first time doing a school talk outside Australia - I hope they enjoyed the experience as much as I did. It certainly seemed like it from the detailed questions I was asked.'

UNITED KINGDOM: 10th Jack Fitzgerald Memorial walks, 11 October – Crawley

Report courtesy of David Ainsworth:

Veterans AC were pleased to host the tenth running of this event on a lakeside course once used as the test bed for Britain's water speed record round popular beauty spot Campbell's lake, formerly a mediaeval hammer pond. The weather was dry and mild, with cloud cover almost throughout. In a smaller than average field of mainly Steyning AC walkers, it was good to see **Anne Jones** back in the results as leader of the pack in the 3 miles; the leaders of the 6 miles, **Trevor Jones** and **Peter Gregoire** posted times only about 2 minutes slower than the previous week's track race, a good result given that it was 325 metres longer and in shared space with other park users. The race was held to raise funds for the RAF Benevolent Fund, as a tribute to RAF fighter pilot Jack Fitzgerald.
