Entry lists for WRW Antalya 24 published

(World Athletics press release – 12 April 2024)



Entry lists for the **World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships Antalya 24** confirm that 431 athletes from 52 countries will descend on Turkiye for the global event on Sunday 21 April.

A total of 198 athletes (108 men, 90 women) are entered for the senior 20km races, while 106 athletes (56 men, 50 women) are set to compete in the U20 races.

The marathon race walk mixed relay makes its World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships debut in Antalya, with Paris 2024 Olympic Games places up for grabs. While the entries by country list features the names of athletes entered by each nation for the relay, athletes entered for other events in Antalya can also be included in the final composition of mixed relay teams.

China topped the medal table at the last edition of the World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships in Muscat, Oman, in 2022, with a total of six gold medals. **Ma Zhenxia** was among the winners two years ago and she is entered to defend her senior women's 20km title fresh from setting a PB of 1:26:07 at the Chinese Race Walking Grand Prix in Taicang on 3 March. Peru's double 2022 world champion **Kimberly Garcia**, who was third in Muscat, and Ecuador's **Glenda Morejon**, who won the 35km race in Muscat, are expected to provide tough opposition.

The fields are stacked and listed for the mixed relay alone are all three reigning Olympic race walk champions – Italy's **Antonella Palmisano**, Italy's **Massimo Stano** and Poland's **Dawid Tomala** – plus Spain's **Alvaro Martin** and **Maria Perez**, who both achieved a 20km and 35km race walk double at last year's World Championships in Budapest.

Tokyo Olympic medallists Lorena Arenas of Colombia, Evan Dunfee of Canada, Jonathan Hilbert of Germany, Koki Ikeda of Japan and Liu Hong of China are also among those listed, as are 2023 world medallists Caio Bonfim of Brazil, Masatora Kawano of Japan and Jemima Montag of Australia.

Sweden's four-time world medallist **Perseus Karlstrom** is entered for the senior men's 20km, two years on from winning the 35km title in Muscat. Bonfim is also listed for this event, along with Ecuador's world 35km silver medallist **Brian Pintado**, Germany's **Christopher Linke**, Japan's **Ryo Hamanishi** and Spain's **Paul McGrath**.

The host nation's squad features multiple world age group medallist **Meryem Bekmez** and world U20 champion **Mazlum Demir**. China's **Li Chenjie** and **Yang Xizhen** lead the lists of entries for the U20 events.

The final start lists will be available on Saturday 20 April.

** WALKER OF THE WEEK **



There were lots to choose from this week. Narrowing it down to one or two wasn't easy, so the size of improvement in both these walkers' results was the arbiter in their selection as this issue's WsOTW.

Lizzie McMillen (NSW, left) had an astonishing race in the Australian 10,000m Walk championship in Adelaide, taking 2nd behind Jemima Montag with a time of 44:33.80 - a 2:41 PB. Walking a well-paced race, Lizzie put in a powerful second half and has now reached the fringe of elite territory for the first time. Now coached by Jared Tallent, Lizzie is in cracking shape and should tackle the 20km in Antalya next weekend with confidence.

Meanwhile, Chelsea Roberts (NSW) took an axe to her own 10,000m PB and ripped an extraordinary 3:18 from it, winning silver in the U20 title in Adelaide with 48:18.08, her first sub-50min result. Now that the door is open, Chelsea has laid waste to any psychological barriers and can knuckle down confidently to following in Lizzie's footsteps and reducing that 10km time

Well done, Lizzie and Chelsea – great results! Now for the future ...

Honourable mentions:

- Isaac Beacroft (NSW) two more 10,000m records for this walking phenomenon in Adelaide. Isaac will attract plenty of notice in Antalya this weekend.
- Declan Tingay (WA) and Rhydian Cowley (VIC) a championship record for Dec and a big PB for Rhyd, who finished a bare 6 secs behind the West Australian. They'll have a big say in the Antalya Mixed Relay results in Turkiye.
- Laelia Byatt (NSW) had the biggest PB result of the day in the 10,000 by 3:50 which also took her under 60mins for the first time and will give her the incentive to improve further. Good work, Laelia!
- Alexandra Griffin (WA) and Nellie Langford (SA) PBs of 1:16 and 0:53 respectively to take to Antalya where they'll team together in the U20 10km.



AUSTRALIAN ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS, 11-19 APRIL - ADELAIDE

**Senior & U20 10,000m Race walk – Thursday 11 April

A new National record, 2 new Championship records and 22 PB performances were among the yield from the first day of race walking competition at Mile End stadium in Adelaide. With many of the 10,000m Senior and U20 contestants headed for the World Teams championships in Antalya (TUR) this week, the form of our most talented walkers was on display for those

fortunate enough to be there, and few would have been disappointed.

There having been no live streaming of the Men's race, the tabled results are our only basis for review. **Declan Tingay** is clearly back to his best record-breaking form, while **Rhydian Cowley** finished closer to the WA speedster than ever before to clock a big PB for silver. **Will Thompson** came achingly close to making it five sub-40:00 finishes on the day. (Oh, to have seen this on live stream ...)

With **Jemima Montag** leading a procession in the Women's 10,000m, the interest was in who would share the podium with her. Live stream scheduling was kinder to the women than it was last year, and while the focus was naturally on Montag viewers were kept abreast of the battle for the placings. It was **Lizzie McMillen**, walking the race of her life, who prevailed over team mate **Allanah Pitcher** with a stunning 2:41 PB that catapulted her into another level. Pitcher also PB'd again, and both she, McMillen and **Hannah Mison** (4th) could be in for big results in the Antalya 20km if the cards fall their way.

Isaac Beacroft continued on his trailblazing way, this time adding the U20 national and championship records and a 0:55 PB to his folio. **Will Bottle's** 0:52 PB for bronze, behind **Marcus Wakim**, came too late for Antalya selection but hurls him into the mix for the World U20 championships in Lima later this year.

Alexandra Griffin led the U20 Women from the gun, pulling away in company with seniors **Hannah Bolton** and **Alanna Peart** for an engrossing contest. The older and more experienced Bolton accelerated 6 laps out, with she and Griffin clocking 1:00-plus PBs and the West Aussie lapping the U20 field for a commanding win. **Chelsea Roberts** didn't simply break the 50-min barrier for the first time – she kicked the door down with a 3:18 PB. **Nellie Langford** brought home a 2nd bronze for the home team, while for the Vics it was heartening to see **Maddison Nash** get her own long-awaited first sub-50.

**U18 & U17 5,000m Race walk - Tuesday 16 April

Bailey Housden, no doubt a bit disappointed with his 10,000m result last Thursday, made no mistake in posting a big win in the U18 5000m. The combined field saw a good tussle between ACT team mates **Owen Toyne** (U18) and **Kodi Clarkson** (U17), with Kodi turning the tables to cross 18secs ahead of his usual conqueror to win the U17 title. **Joel Byatt** made his first podium finish in a national track championship and team mate **Dylan Allabush** his first since 2021.

It was the 'Sienna Pitcher Show' (see what I did there?) in the girls combined race, with livestream keeping Allanah's younger sib very much in centre-screen. Like Bailey Housden, Sienna had a bit of an off-night last Thursday and wasted no time establishing who was boss on this occasion. It was thus another case of the interest being in the placings, with Ciara Cassilles surprising to finish a clear 2nd ahead of Matilda Webb, who completed the expected NSW trifecta by holding off a determined Ariana Pashutina. Meanwhile, Angelina Legrande capped off her best season yet with a convincing U17 title win (you could almost feel the heat from coach Kim Mottrom's grin from across the border!) Milly Sharpe and Kaytee Bogaers shared the podium.

Tim Erickson is welcome to correct me on this but the first walker featured, I think, may be **Henry Laskau** of the USA. (I stand ready to be enlightened, Tim.)

There's no doubt about the identity of the 'foreign legionnaire' finishing in darkness – it was **Don Thompson** (GBR) winning Olympic gold in the 50km at Rome in 1960.
