For the first time since the winter, the WOTW award returns to Victoria – to two Victorians, in fact. **Marcus Wakim** and **Riley Coughlan** both had a brilliant weekend of racing, each recording huge PBs on successive days.

Marcus and Riley both raced over 3000m in the AVSL competition at Doncaster last Saturday. Marcus (Collingwood Harriers) lowered his PB to 13:08.1, while Riley (Knox Athletics) cut his own by a similar margin to record 13:40.2. These performances, strong as they were, turned out to be warm-ups for what they would produce the following day in the VRWC season opener at Middle Park.

Marcus (15yo), who had never raced the distance before, produced one of the best debuts over 10km seen in a long time, going out hard with seasoned rivals and posting an excellent 47:02. 14yo Riley, not to be outdone, also latched onto the fast pack early and was rewarded with a PB of over 7 minutes for his 49:28.

Congratulations to both lads, who have worked to improve their fitness through the lockdowns and seized their opportunity when it came.

The paucity of racing opportunities since July made no difference – they'd trained hard, 10km was on offer, two Tokyo Olympians were amongst them and they made hay while the sun ... well, sort of shone.

It was a cold and breezy morning, but we saw a healthy meet size of 35 walkers. It had been a long time since our last VRWC races – Sunday 1st August to be exact – and I think we could hear the collective sighs of appreciation from across Melbourne! It followed on from round one of the Athletics Victoria Shield competition on Saturday and, for most of the walkers, this was their second walk for the weekend.

Several open races were held over a range of distances (1.5km, 3km, 5km and 10km), with the **10km** providing the highlights of the day. Out in front were Olympians **Kyle Swan** (43:10) and **Bec Henderson** (47:09), showcasing their stuff. One unfortunate consequence of the lockdown was the Club's inability to give Kyle, Bec, Jemima Montag and Rhydian Cowley a timely, congratulatory 'welcome home' after their Sapporo efforts, and it was great to be able to do so for two of them on Sunday.

Also making his presence felt was 15 year old **Marcus Wakim** who posted a time of 47:02 in his first ever 10km walk – a wonderful debut over a demanding distance. Coached now by Adam Garganis, Marcus's progress this year has been remarkable and a great future lies ahead. The same can be said of 14 year old **Riley Coughlan** who walked a stunning 7 minute PB of 49:28, while 18 year old **Alanna Peart** was close to her PB with 48:35. All in all, there were seven sub-50 minute performances ... a fine result. Hard work pays off.

Further back, youngsters **Eden Morgan, Ariana Pashutina, Maddison Nash, Emily Smith** and **Daniel Pashutin** also impressed over the longer distance. The duel between **Ariana** and **Madeleine Feain** was a compelling one, with Maddie's strength giving her the upper hand at the end. Great stuff! Hard luck story of the day had to be that of 12 yearold **Daniel Pashutin**, who battled the conditions doggedly on his own in his first 10km, only to miss the 1-hour barrier by a bare 4 seconds! Hang in there, Daniel, more 10kms are awaiting your attention.

I must mention that we welcomed **Brad Simpson** back for his first club walk in over 6 years. Finally, joining us for the first time was 85yo former marathener **Bruce Watt**, who toughed it out well in his first road walk over 10kms.

FRANCE: Armistice Day commemorative races, Thursday 11 November - Bar le Duc & Mt Sainte Odile

Emmanuel Tardi offers an extensive report on a day of great solemnity in France – 11 November. While top-level road racing may have finished for the year, ultra-distance and commemorative meets such as the ones below are still being held in France:

'November 11th is a non-working day in France because it marks the end of the First World War. Two walking races have been organised on this date for many years.

The first, the **Grand Prix de la Voie Sacrée** (*The Sacred Way*), is an 57.4km long race between Verdun and Bar le Duc. The race has been held each year since 1980. In even years, it goes from Bar le Duc to Verdun and in odd years, it goes from Verdun to Bar le Duc.

The road used is a memorial road. It is the only road in France which doesn't have a number; it's only named *"La Voie Sacrée"*. It was along this road that more than one million soldiers travelled to the famous awful Battle of Verdun in 1916. Most of them never came back.

At each kilometre of the road, there is a memorial milestone, with a soldier's helmet on it. History of this road (in French) here : http://fr.wikipedia.org/wiki/Voie sacr%C3%A9e %28Verdun%29

Unfortunately, there were only 5 starters this year, a very small number for this walk. At the 9AM start, the temperature was around 5°C with lots of fog, but the sun arrived fast and it was great weather for walkers.

Local walker, Christophe Erard easily won the race for the 5th time after 2002, 2003, 2012 and 2016.

There was an ancillary event from Erize to Bar le Duc (22km). Start was at 12am. Teammates Nadir Herida and Sonia Demon (from Reims) won this event. Herida battled against Arthur Bonnomet during the first half of the race. Demon always had a big gap from Adeline Brastel (2'40 at km 15) but had a big problem in the last 3 kilometers and won by only 30 seconds.

Winners Hérida and Demon

'The second race was shorter - only 8.5km - but very hard. The goal was to climb to the summit of **Mont Sainte-Odile**, a peak of the Vosges Mountains in Alsace. The race started at Klingenthal (280m altitude) at 9:30AM and finished at the convent of Mont-Sainte-Odile (750m altitude). The first 2 kilometers are not too bad but, after that, there is a consistent slope of around 7% to the summit.

It is the *<u>oldest racewalking event in France</u>* (the first edition was held in 1935) and the best time of 45:37 was set in 1981 by Belgian walker Gérard Goujon.

This year, only 40 walkers started the race, with the temperature a cold 5°C. The winner was 25 year old Florian Mayer, who won for the 7th time in row. Alejandra Ramirez-Gomez won for the 5th time (4th in row).'

After the update of the women we will start with that of the foreign athletes which represents the most important and interesting part (also in this case both those in activity and those of the Hall of Fame.

Our goal is to finish this update before the end of year holidays 2021. We hope to succeed.'
