WALKER OF THE WEEK

It was the kids' turn to take centre stage last Saturday, at the second staging of the Little Athletics Victoria road walk championships, so it's no surprise that this week's WOTW would come from the results produced in that meet. I've not had the opportunity to chase up every PB recorded on the day but one I did find was a stand-out ... that of **Georgia Walters (VIC)**, of the Diamond Valley LAC.

A regular VRWC racer last year, Georgia hasn't been seen as much at Middle Park in 2025. However, she clearly has gained in fitness and speed. Her winning time of **7:57** in the U11 1.5km was a PB by a whopping 1:27, smashing the time she set at these championships last year when she was 2nd in the U10. We hope to see more of Georgia at the Club in the future, and we wish her continued improvement and further great results.

- Alaska Bremner (VIC) hailing from Warrnambool in the state's south west, Alaska had a great win in the U14 All Schools 3km championship in May, and it took a huge effort by WOTW Georgia to keep her from another title this time. Her silver in 8:05 in her first 1.5km is a sure sign of big things to come.
- Anna Dubar (VIC) another to smash her previous best by a huge chunk, taking third behind Georgia and Alaska with a 0:46 PB of 8:34.
- Angus Shuttleworth (VIC) turned on a 2km time trial in the biting wind to clock a fast 9:08 an 11 sec PB.

LAVic Road Walk championships, 14 June – Middle Park

Following the above races, a pleasing turnout of 81 starters converged on the lakeside course for the second edition of the Little Athletics Victoria road walk championships. The wind had abated slightly by this time but the youngsters still had to slog into it on the northward legs. The VRWC membership – past and present – was well represented and showed the benefit of Club racing experience, while many of the other, as-yet unconnected competitors showed excellent technique and racing skill. Winter bugs have to be considered of course, which probably explained the no-show of 11 entrants.

The only real disappointment was the sparse entry among the mid-teenage ranks. This can, in part, be put down to commitment to winter team sports with clubs and schools, but a certain 'thinning out' was also noticeable in these age groups at the State track titles in March. We hope that, now that these road championships are established and knowledge of the VRWC's activities is spreading, the appeal of road racewalking will take hold at an age level from which we'd expect to draw our future senior champions. A track 1500m may not hold much appeal beyond a certain age, but a road 3km might.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

FRANCE: Soiree de Saint Maur, 11 June - Saint Maur

Emmanuel Tardi reports on another annual celebration of athletics in France, giving **Aurelien Quinion** his second chance in two days to dazzle with speed.

One day after the Montreuil race, another racewalking event was organised in the eastern suburbs of Paris.

The city of Saint Maur organises, every Wednesday from June to September, the very famous "*soirées* de Saint-Maur". It is running events, and thousand and thousand runners have run each year since 1975.

Sometimes they organize racewalking event and it was this year! We had 50 starters in the 2 races: 3000m at 7:25pm and 5000m at 7:55pm.

In the 5000m **Aurelien Quinion** won in the excellent time of **19:12**, one day after he walked **19:08** in Montreuil. In the womens 5000m, young **Daphné Gateau-Fernez** walked a very regular pace (4'29" at km 1, 13'29" at km 3) and finished the race in **22:28**, faster than the French record, **22:53.54**, by Lena Auvray in 2023.)

Unfortunately, this record will not be validated because there were not enough national judges (there were 5 judges, 4 were regional level and one was national. The French federation want 3 national judges to validate national records.)

I was not in Saint Maur ... because I need to work ... sometimes.

I was racewalking judge (again) in Tilburg this Sunday for the Nederland National Championship (20k men and 10k women.) The 20k was scheduled to start at 11am and the 10k at 12pm.

As usual the race took place on a perfect road, generally used for Roller races. Absolutely flat with very large curves. In the 20k, **André Van Slooten** won the national title. **Remco De Bruin** walked a few laps with him but decelerated and was caught by **Van Wijngaarden** for 2nd place.

In the 10k, Anne Van Andel won the title easily.

In the men's open race, **Matthew Glennon** (IRL) won easily. In women's open race, **Aisling Lane** walked with her brother and won.

** Vale John Farrington 1942 - 2025 **

The racewalking community has an historic connection with the Marathon and distance running family. Thus, it is fitting that we salute the late **John Farrington**, NSW marathoner and dual Olympian, who died at the weekend.

John had a singular link with the VRWC, in that he and **Bob Gardiner** were Australian team mates at the altitude-blighted Mexico Olympics in 1968. Both were severely affected by the heat and oxygen deprivation, finishing in times far slower than their best domestic results (John 43rd in the marathon, Bob 19th in the 50km walk), but finishing nonetheless. Their link, sadly, doesn't end there. Selected for the 1972 Munich Olympics, injury forced both Bob and John to miss those Games at the last minute. Both were in their best ever form and one can only imagine how they'd have fared at sea level on the roads of the Bavarian capital.

Our condolences go out to John's family, friends and all who are saddened by his passing.

David Tarbotton announced John's passing as follows:

Sad news over the weekend with the passing of one of Australia and NSW's great distance runners, **John Farrington**. He set his marathon PB of **2:11.13** in the NSW championship at Richmond in 1973, 52 years ago. He won seven Australian titles, 2 NSW and three City to Surf races.

His only Australian XC title, in 1971, was one of the most dramatic races in history, when a river on the course at Macquarie University in Sydney became flooded and the runners were forced to wade through chest high water. He won by nearly a minute.

- he moved to Adelaide late in his career

- City to Surf three wins & five consecutive podiums.
- PBs 5000m 13:59.0 (70), 10,000m 29:16.2 (70), Half Marathon 65:12 (73), Marathon 2:11.13 (73)

DOGS OFF LEASH

At our championships day on Sunday 18 May, one of our race judges had cause to lodge a formal report concerning several dogs whose owners had seen fit to let them run untethered in a 'KEEP DOGS ON LEASH' area, very close to the northern turn of our course. At least one dog had been free to roam onto the path itself.

There is official signage on the path next to the Bowling Club fence in that area, requiring that dogs be kept on leash. Whether it was unseen or ignored by the dog owners, it resulted in a safety risk and was a source of anxiety for our competitors.

The incident was reported to Parks Victoria, who will advise their rostered rangers to patrol the area and undertake dog education measures if necessary.
