** 2024 U16-U14 WALKERS OF THE YEAR **

While walkers in this age range race in a variety of distances from 1500m to 5000m, their championship distance (outside of Little Athletics) is 3000m. These lists, therefore, are compiled according to their best 3km performances for 2024, as recorded at *racewalkaustralia.com* (The times listed there are in whole seconds, not decimal parts.)

Heading the lists are two of the country's most exciting prospects, **Ela Uzun (VIC)** and **Callum Martin (NSW)**. The two 13-year olds have posted times far in advance of their years. Neither appears to have over-raced in the past twelve months and are being coached and mentored in a way that is developing their talent while providing for that all-important value in any sport - enjoyment. A tad older, **Sophie Polkinghorne (NSW)** and **Max Davidson (VIC)** both produced dominant performances in 2024, taking charge of every race they entered in this age range and keeping it to the finish.

The depth that has been evident in NSW for many years is reflected in these tables, particularly among the girls. Victoria is playing catch-up but starting to make up ground, while individual talent from the other states is also featured in the lists, indicating that the sport is making progress across the board at Little Athletics level. The emergence of **Noah Cooke** and **Liam Domoney**, for example, will hearten many who've regarded the smaller male cohort countrywide with concern.

The coming State and National T&F championships will bring together most of these young athletes in a bid for supremacy. There will, no doubt, be a few others who've starred in their local LA centres but are yet to make their splash at this level. The U16 and U14 titles can usually be counted on to produce a surprise or two, from a 'new' athlete or a known one who takes a big step up in standard. They are always compelling races, in themselves and in what they suggest about Australia's international walking future. We await the first week of April in Perth with eagerness.

Myles Ashby and Callum Martin (NSW), competing in the U20 and U17 3000m fields concurrently, turned on a contest in atrocious weather and were together most of the way before Myles cut loose, crossing in 13:04 to Callum's 13:10. Both lads would likely have gone sub-13:00 in better conditions. As it was, both set new meet records, fitting reward for both.

Not to be outdone, **Sienna Pitcher (NSW)** also set a new meet record – relieving big sister Allanah of hers – in taking the Women's U20 3000m title with a time of **14:10**. As with the boys above, Sienna would likely have broken a barrier (14:00) had conditions been favourable, and it's to her credit that she finished only 11 secs adrift of her PB.

Well done to all three record breakers. With the pointy end of the summer approaching, we look forward to seeing you in State and national title action soon.

U.S.A. US 35km Race walk championship & International invitational - Santee

Perseus Karlström and Valeria Ortuño win 35km walk in Santee, CA. Nick Christie and Katie Burnett win U.S. titles (2025)

Under foreign dominance and absolute victories by the Swede **Perseus Karlström** and the Mexican **Valeria Ortuño**, the United States Open Championships of 35 km road walking were held this Sunday (12/1), taking place in Santee, in the state of California, a city that has hosted 15 national championships of the discipline in the last 17 years.

In the men's race, Karlström was one of the event's leading figures, winning emphatically (despite physical difficulties in the final part), with **2:27:19**, a time that, although not a personal best (he holds 2:23:44 obtained in Eugene, OR), constitutes a championship record and also a minimum for direct qualification (2:28:00) for the world championships in Tokyo this year. In Santee, he obtained 42:23 in the 10 km, 1:24:27 in the 20 km (partial of 42:04), 2:06:05 in the 30 km (20:50+20:48=41:38) and 21:14 in the last 5 km.

In second place overall was Mexican Ever Palma Olivares, with 2:37:46, and in third place, the US champion was Nick Christie, with 2:45:31, who is the national record holder for the distance (2:36:47 in Zittau-2024). Jordan Crawford and Michael Mannozzi, fourth and fifth placed, climbed to the 2nd and 3rd places on the national podium, with 2:46:20 and 3:03:51 respectively. A total of 15 athletes participated.

In the women's race, **Valeria Ortuño Martínez** set her personal best for the distance with **2:51:55** (and championship record), with split times at 10 km of 49:43, 48:51 (20 km, 1:38:34) and 48:52 (30 km, 2:27:26), finishing at an increasing pace, with 24:07 in the last 5 km, and 4:44 in the final km (the fastest).

Her compatriot Nadia Lizeth Martínez and 22-year-old Canadian Olivia Lundman were in the immediate positions, with 3:02:49 and 3:03:16 respectively.

As for the athletes in the national championship, the competition was lively, with **Katie Burnett**, the national record holder for the distance (and also for the 50 km), taking the lead and distancing herself from her rivals from the 20 km mark to win the national title with a time of **3:05:10** (4th, class). In the immediate places were **Miranda Melville**, with **3:05:52**, an athlete who was 2 minutes and 27 seconds behind the leader, reducing the gap to 42 seconds at the finish line, and **Maria Michta-Coffey**, with **3:09:57**, who led until the 20 km mark. Ten athletes took part.

In other open events held simultaneously with the 35 km championship, the benchmark for the winners was the 20 km, Mexicans Carlos Mercenario Arsof, with 1:24:11, and Ilse Guerrero Rodarte, with 1:32:11; in the 10 km, Americans Emmanuel Corvera, with 44:36, and Celina Lepe-Corvera, with 51:12; and in the 5 km, Mexican Sofia Ramos Rodríguez, with 23:37, and the very young Langston Coleman (only 10 years old), with 31:32. In this event (5 km), special mention should be made of the participation of the recently elected president of the United States Track and Field Federation (USATF) and Olympic race walker Curt Clausen (57 years old, 31:37).

To access an English version, open the page in Google Chrome – if you haven't already – at <u>https://omarchador.blogspot.com</u>, then right click on any empty space (not on text) on the page. A window will appear with the option to translate the page. Click on it, and the page should reload in English.

To all present and aspiring Race Walking coaches

I am writing to you to inform you that Athletics Victoria have assigned a **Racewalking Practical Coaching course** as part of their coaching courses. It can be accessed through the AV members portal, search under Coaching courses. The heading about is also a link to the information page. The course will be conducted at Mentone athletic track on **Saturday 1**st **March from 1.00 – 4.30pm**.

The Racewalking course is designed to enhance your coaching expertise, focusing on both technical and practical aspects of the discipline. It covers key aspects of coaching, including mastering correct technique, implementing drills to refine mechanics, addressing common technical faults, understanding biomechanics to improve performance and prevent injuries, and planning training programs tailored to athletes' needs and goals. This course will equip you with the tools and knowledge to coach race walkers effectively, improving their technical proficiency and competitive performance.

This course is open to accredited coaches and contributes credits toward Level 3 Performance Coach accreditation. Eligibility for the course is anyone who has a Level 1 or Level 2 coaching qualification.

For those who would like to begin their coaching journey and be able to attend the racewalking practical course, there are a few courses being conducted by Athletics Victoria that are available on their coaching page as part of the members portal. I would recommend applying for one of these courses before applying for the racewalk coaching course.

My recommendation is:

 Level 2 Development coaching course – This is mostly online and has a practical component on Saturday 9th February.

However, the other course options are:

- Level 1 Youth course
- Recreational Running Course Level 1

I am looking forward to seeing coaches at the first racewalking practical course for many years.

Editor's Note:

Club coach **Mark Donahoo** has done an enormous amount of work to get a **practical** coaching course, specifically for race walking, up and operating under the auspices of Athletics Victoria and, by extension, Athletics Australia.

This is something of which aspiring and practicing coaches have been starved for well over a decade ... a development pathway for present race walking coaches and a means of introducing the basics of race walk coaching to novice coaches, so that they may start their own development journey.

There is no way to be sure of how many prospective walkers out there (especially at Little Athletics level) have withered on the vine for want of informed coaches and mentors. Some are noticed at their centres and are clearly 'naturals', or are at least good at it or just want to do more. LAVic centres with little or no race walk coaching expertise in their ranks are urged to avail themselves of this opportunity by advertising it around their clubs.

Nor are the youngsters the only ones in need. Adults of all ages, including those eligible for Masters competition, need proper coaching advice to help them get a foot in the door to our sport, especially if time, injury or circumstance have excluded them from whatever sports they played before. We have to reach these budding walkers and help them grow. Mark's course outline below will help you to embark upon that journey:
