Julia Baldy had easily the fastest time on the day, 5:44, while Zoe Bowkett also hit the PB list with a brisk 6:14. Haris Ali was another big improver, putting it all together in the 1km for a handicap-winning PB of 6:44.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

LITHUANIA: 48th Race Walking Festival (inc. Lithuanian & Latvian c'ships), Friday 20 May - Alytus

Emmanuel Tardi lets no grass grow beneath him! Having made the journey from Spain to Lithuania, he reports on a race walking carnival held in a very different environment from that in Madrid last week. Good to see some Ukrainian walkers racing here, achieving some success and hopefully gaining a needed morale boost from the sporting fellowship on offer.

A few days after Madrid, I was appointed as judge in Alytus (Lithuania) for the 48th Racewalking Festival. For this year, it was a new circuit. Walkers started on the stadium then went on the road where they walked 19 laps, then they came back for finishing on the track of the stadium.

The start was at 11:30am for men and 11:35am for women. It was also the Lithuanian and Latvian Championship for 20k men and women. Some Ukrainian walkers (who train now in Lithuania and in Poland) were also in the race.

In the Men race, there was only one leader: **Marius Ziukas**, who won the race easily in **1:25:48**. **Arnis Rumbenieks** and **Artur Mastianca** walked together, and finally Rumbenieks won 2^{nd} place by only two seconds.

In the women's event, Ukrainian **Olena Sobchuk** won the race very easily in **1:30:59** (44:48 at 10k) with a 7-min difference to local racewalker **Brigita Virbalyte**. Brigita held a few seconds' gap from **Austeja Kavaliauskaite** (3rd). She was helped by Ivzans because they walked together for most of the race.

I want to give a special mention. In the youth race, I saw a young Ukrainian (**Anna Borysiuk**, born in 2009) winning a 1k in **4:34** in a perfect style. I was very impressed.
