WALKER OF THE WEEK



WOTW this week takes us, once more, to Brisbane, where a special track 10,000m walk was held during a QA night meeting.

The race saw **Noah Cooke (QLD, 15yo)** make his first attempt at the distance and stamp himself as a definite prospect for the elite ranks with a wonderful initial time of **48:05.50**. Launching into a duel from the gun with international rep Tayla Billington, Noah was able to draw away in the final stages for a clear win. A fine debut and a perfect lead up to the All Schools titles in Melbourne.

Three WOTW awards in four weeks must be some kind of a record, but how could one not select **Phoebe Chadwick (QLD)** for her 3rd one, given the improvement curve she is on right now? Competing in the same QA 10,000m, Phoebe seized the opportunity presented by a cool breeze after a humid day to set an amazing 3:30 PB with her time of **56:13.71**. This is the largest in a string of bests she has posted over the past month and is the



outcome of a resolute focus and diligent training.

Well done, Noah and Phoebe. Your progress and results demonstrate your commitment to the sport.

- Owen Toyne (ACT) clocked his second sub-20:00 5000m with a 0:19 PB time of 19:39 in Capital Athletics interclub.



AROUND THE COUNTRY



2025 AUSTRALIAN ATHLETICS MARATHON RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS - Saturday 29 November, Canberra

Australian racewalking history will be made at the Stromlo Sports Park in Canberra on Saturday 29, when a bona fide Marathon Race walk title will be contested for the first time. Now mandated by WA as the championship distance race for walking, the MRW's appearance as our long national championship (replacing the 50km and 35km) will be among the first for this controversial event anywhere in the world, and it's likely that observers of the sport will take a keen interest in the results out of Canberra.

The fields are large enough for effective competition and loaded with talent – talent which is rapidly being matched by experience. A background in 35km racing will be an asset. More advantageous still will be having raced over 50km, enjoyed (if that's the word) by five entrants - Rhydian Cowley, Dylan Richardson, Kelly Ruddick, Carl Gibbons and Kim Mottrom. Cowley is by far the best-credentialled, with an Olympic top-10 finish (8th) in 2021. For the others, time may have blurred the memory somewhat (all bar Cowley last raced the 50 in 2019 or earlier) but that last 7km on those banked Stromlo bends is sure to raise a zombie or two. It's hard to see Rhydian being headed here, but fellow Vic **Will Thompson** has thrown out challenges to him over 35km and will bear watching. Likewise, **Dylan Richardson** will relish a distance closer to his heart (where the 50km lived) and will be out to post a strong result.

Olivia Sandery should have a lock on the women's title, while the distribution of minor medals may hinge simply on who can last longest, this being alien territory for everyone except Ruddick. **Lizzy McMillen** will be Sandery's main challenger and is the only other one here with a proven 35km record.

NEW ZEALAND: Dame Yvette Williams Memorial Meet, 22 November - Dunedin



In New Zealand, international athletes **Jonah Cropp** and **Laura Langley** were the winners of the 5,000-meter track walk event, which was part of the pre-program of the "Memorial Dame Yvette Williams" Athletics Meeting, named after the first New Zealand woman to win an Olympic gold medal (Helsinki-1952, long jump). The event took place last Saturday (November 22nd) in Dunedin, in the Otago region.

In the men's race, 20-year-old Jonah Cropp, representing Sumner Running Club, won with a time of **21:13.55**, his best time in the distance being 20:57.60 in Christchurch/2024. Second place went to under-20 runner **Toby O'Rorke** of Egmont Athletics,

with a personal best of 22:30.69, while third place went to Alexander Brown of Caversham Harrier & Athletics Club, with 26:26.63.

In the women's race, 28-year-old **Laura Langley** of North Canterbury Athletic Club achieved a resounding victory with a new personal best of **22:35.36**. It's worth remembering that last June in Canberra, she set her country's best time in the 35km (3:14:33). Following her were the very young **Alysa Brown Selwyn** (16 years old) of Athletic Club and **Annabelle Grant** (15 years old) of Papanui TocH Athletic Club, with times of **28:59.76** and **30:49.71**, respectively.
