**** WALKER OF THE WEEK ****



As is often the way with championships and other special events outside the normal program, the incentive is there to produce a little extra, especially if the conditions are right. They certainly were at Middle Park on Sunday. It was a day of meritorious performances, with strong racing and many PBs as walkers vied for championship medals. Accordingly, our WOTW comes from Sunday's results.

15yo **Riley Coughlan**, several times an 'honourable mention' here, takes this week's award following his 3:09 improvement in the AV U20 Schools 10km championship for a time of **46:19** – a huge step-up. Duelling for the title with **Marcus Wakim**, Riley left it all out there, falling only 1:06 behind at the finish after pushing Marcus to his own new PB. An assiduous trainer intent on improvement, Riley has broken through into another level this season and is one of the exciting cohort of young male walkers from whom the next Australian reps will be drawn.

Well done, Riley! Hard work pays off.

*Honourable mentions:

- Declan Tingay (WA) & Kyle Swan (VIC) Dec with a winning 15km time of 59:59 and Kyle an AV title win in 1:00:51 (a PB of nearly 7mins), on a course with few long straights and numerous tight turns.
- Sebastian Richards (SA, 14yo) a sub-30min effort over 5.1km in the SARWC Mountain championships, negotiating a climb of 215 vertical metres.
- Lily Bowkett (VIC) a 2:23 improvement in a 1.5km race is impressive in any competition.
- Marcus Wakim (VIC) a 10km result of 45:13 a 43sec PB to take out the U20 AV title.
- Eva Reid (VIC) another to score a big improvement in her school colours by 1:31 for the U16 3km title.





AV 15km & Schools c'ships, Sunday 26 June – Middle Park



With a full program of overseas races this year, we haven't seen many of our top walkers at Middle Park for the winter program. Therefore, finding no fewer than six (6) current Olympians (and one former one) hitting the 2k circuit for the AV 15km championship was something to savour, as it promised fast, high-quality racing. And so it proved.

Declan Tingay, competing by invitation, surged away in the second half to cross first and break 1 hour by a bare second. This was equivalent to a 1:20:00 20km ... impressive stuff considering the absence of long straights on the Middle Park club course. Jemima Montag, in cracking form, took the women's title in 1:09:12, finishing with plenty in the tank. The course's twists and loops were no barrier to Kyle Swan and Bec Henderson as both smashed previous bests by huge margins, with Kyle winning the men's title and Rhydian Cowley not too far from his own PB for silver.

Char Hay ventured into new territory, walking her first 15 for a creditable **1:22:08** and bronze. Also on the podium was **Michael Harvey**, a veteran of the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics and many times an international, who still finds the call of his old racing days hard to resist and paid one of his welcome visits, adding another bronze to his collection in **1:46:00**.

Donning their school's sports uniform seemed to provide an extra shot of the right kind of juice for six of our Schools titles contenders, who rose to the occasion with good PB performances. Marcus Wakim (45:13) and Riley Coughlan (46:19) led the way with exemplary showings in the U20 10km, while Eva Reid, in her first VRWC season, blew her 3km time to pieces with 16:38 for the U16 title.

For the second frustrating time, **Scott Peart** equalled his 5km personal best of **24:34** – surely it can't hold out much longer! **Beau McKinnon**, another having his initial full road season, made big inroads in the U14 3km with his **18:17**.

Ariana Pashutina, Daniel Pashutin and Ela Uzun rounded out the School champions list, while Matilda Read, recently turned 12, made a good debut over 3km in the U14 race with 19:13 for the 1½ laps.

VRWC Club c'ships & Open races, Sunday 26 June – Middle Park

Five PBs and a slew of first-time distance efforts were pleasing results in the VRWC Club championship and non-championship races, held in conjunction with the AV and Schools titles

The VRWC 15km title and Elsie Jacobsen Trophy went to **Bec Henderson**, while **Char Hay's** debut 15km result earned her the U20 Club championship alongside **Geromi Tucker**, also walking his first 15 in a strong **1:23:31** to take the U20 Men's title.

Quentin Rew, in his final-ever race in Australia, scored an impressive 1:27 PB time of 1:01:56, showing he's in great nick to represent New Zealand in Eugene and Birmingham. Another breaking the ice over 15km was Alejandro Stephens, whose 1:22:50 saw him beat his 5km and 10km PBs en route – a huge improvement in his first walking season. Madeleine Feain wasn't about to be left out of the PB-fest, taking nearly 3¹/₂ off her 15km time for 1:28:36

At the other end of the height chart, Lily Bowkett showed you don't need a big distance to be a big improver, her 1km time of 9:55 eclipsing her previous best by 2:23! Mya McClure and Jaida Robertson both had good performances to take out the younger Age group titles.

Marion Fawkes – outstanding services to and performances in race walking recognised

by Peter Fawkes

From Peter Fawkes (husband of 1979 World Walking Cup champion **Marion Fawkes**) comes this item, published last week by Tony Taylor in the *Lancashire Walking Club* newsletter:

You may well know that Marion is currently President of Yorkshire Walking Club as well as being a life member of that Club and North Shields Poly. Marion's name was put forward by the Department for Digital, Culture Media & Sport (for outstanding services and performances to women's race walking) to attend a Queens' Garden Party event just before Covid hit and of course, it was cancelled.

We thought that was the end of it but in May, she received another invite and we attended a Garden Party on 25th May 2022. It's taken over 40 years to be recognised but good all the same.

For the record, the then-VAWC's great interest in Marion's race at the 1979 World Walking Cup at Eschborn, West Germany, was the performances of the Aussie women, who were competing internationally for the first time. Their team of 4 comprised three VAWC members - **Sue Orr-Cook, Sally Pierson** and **Lorraine Young-Jachno**, with Queensland's **Karen Iselin** rounding out the squad. The Aussies acquitted themselves well for a team 4th place, with Sue missing the podium by a mere 17secs.

This competition – male and female – proved a turning point in Australia's international race walking representation opportunities, marking the first meeting in which we identified as a player outside of the Commonwealth. It was also the beginning of reasonable funding for our walkers to be able to compete overseas. Had it been only three years earlier that

Willi Sawall, Tim Erickson and Robin Whyte had had to scrape together whatever of their own funds they could to find to get themselves to Sweden for the IAAF 50km championship?

Notable in this US championship race was the presence of Ukraine's **Valeriya Sholomitska**. It will be remembered that Sholomitska finished 4th in Muscat back in March, one place ahead of Olivia Sandery (AUS), after an emotional starting line tribute of solidarity from her fellow competitors and from Sebastian Coe. On this result it appears she has held her form well while she trains for Cali, in effective exile from her homeland.

To put this in perspective, see this race preview from Erik Boal, published in the Runner Space blog:

"Before she steps on the starting line Friday for the 10,000-meter racewalk at the USATF U20 Championships, **Valeriya Sholomitska** understands the magnitude of what it means for a Ukrainian athlete to be racing anywhere in the world right now.

For the first time in American history, two athletes from outside the country will be allowed to compete in an outdoor national championship meet, when Sholomitska and (1500m runner) Yuliya Petryk participate as invited guests of USATF in search of qualifying marks to race again Aug. 1-6 at the World Under-20 Championships in Cali, Colombia.

The last time competitors of any age from outside the U.S. were given permission to compete at a national championship event was at an indoor final in the early 1990s.

But an exception was granted for both athletes as a result of a necessity to have opportunities to qualify for the World Under-20 Championships, since neither individual has competed anywhere in more than three months after being forced to flee the country at the outset of the war with Russia.

Sholomitska, 17, hasn't raced since March, competing for Ukraine at the World Racewalking Team Championships in Oman.

She boasts a 10-kilometer road personal-best effort of 46:09 and a 10,000-meter track mark of 46:20.91, both achieved last year, requiring her to produce a mark in Friday's final of 50:40 or faster in order to represent Ukraine in Colombia.

Sholomitska and Petryk have been traveling with coach and guardian **Olena Borysiuk**, 31, since March, visiting Oman, Turkey and Italy, before returning to Ukraine for six days, only to travel again to Turkey and then eventually arrive June 12 in the United States.

Borysiuk and her athletes have been living in Colorado Springs with American racewalk professionals **Dave Talcott** and **Erin Taylor-Talcott**, before visiting Eugene this week and staying with local residents **Maureen Pollock** and **Goetz Klopfer**.

For the US it was also a positive day, with three U20 women breaking 50mins in the same race, for the first time ever.
